## **Glenbrae Riding Club Conditions of Entry**

- No postal entries accepted – entries through Clubentries website and on the day entries only
- No cheques will be accepted on day of show - cash entries only
- All dressage entries must be booked in advance - no entries on the day
- All horses attending the show must have their flu vaccinations up to date within the last 12-month period. Please ensure that you bring your horse's passport with you to the show. We will be conducting random passport inspections upon arrival at the show ground
- No lunging on the show field
- Strictly no galloping on the field
- If the organisers feel that the handler has insufficient control over the animal, the handler will be asked to remove the animal from the showground
- Horses and ponies competing in ridden classes must be 4 years old and over
- All animals must be sound
- All dogs must be kept on leads
- All persons whilst mounted must wear a properly fitted and secured hard hat which conforms to the current standard, and they must be dressed in a correct and proper manner
- Young handlers are required to wear properly fitted hard hat
- The organisers reserve the right to instruct any competitor to leave the field
- If, in the opinion of the organiser, a horse requires veterinary attention, this will be sought with or without the consent of the owner/rider
- The judge's decision is final
- Classes may be amalgamated or split at judge's discretion
- Objections to be lodged at the Secretaries tent with a £20 deposit which will be returned if the appeal is successful
- CONDUCT: If the conduct of any exhibitor is such as shall, in the opinion of the organiser, be injurious to the character or interest of the show, or shall an exhibitor cause cruelty or unnecessary suffering or neglect of any animal, then the organiser may refuse their entry
- Glenbrae Riding Club or anyone acting on their behalf will not be held responsible for any damage, injury to person, vehicle or horse howsoever caused
- It is recommended that competitors have Third Party Insurance
- Whilst every reasonable effort will be made to accommodate exhibitors showing in more than 1 ring, classes will NOT be held up and exhibitors must choose in which class they will compete in the event of a clash
- If for any reason GRC requires to reschedule date of show, refunds will be issued to competitors unable to make new the date if they contact the show secretary within 2 weeks of the rescheduling announcement
- If a competitor cancels an entry to a class no refunds will be given

Refreshments and toilet facilities will be available on the day
